



SPRING BREAK IN HAITI

MARCH 6 – 13, 2010

EXPLORING DIFFERENCE IN A DIFFERENT WORLD



WHO: Undergraduate and Graduate students currently enrolled and taking classes at NKU are eligible to participate.

PURPOSE: To explore a diverse culture and reflect on our personal responses to difference, while participating in service learning in a

third world country. One credit hour of service learning will be earned through participation in this trip.

ACTIVITIES: NKU students will have opportunities to visit with Haitian students and participate in their classrooms, engage in a cultural exchange with students and teachers, participate in leadership opportunities, and visit national monuments while learning about Haitian history.

In addition, NKU students will engage in a daily reflection and discussion as we interpret our experiences and explore our responses to difference.

We will meet at least three times prior to leaving, using the time to learn about Haitian culture, explore issues related to diversity, and prepare ourselves for the trip.

COST: \$2,575 per student (All costs are subject to change in the event of increases in monetary exchange rates, airfare, or other changes in program costs. In some cases, program items may be deleted in lieu of a price increase).

HOW TO APPLY: Complete an application and submit to **UC 415** along with a **copy of your passport, 1 passport size photo,** and a **\$200 deposit** by **December 1, 2009** to the Office of Education Abroad.



SCHOLARSHIPS: Scholarship money is available to help qualified NKU students finance study abroad. Submit an International Study Scholarship application along with an official transcript, a faculty letter of recommendation, and a personal essay by **January 22, 2010** to the Office of Education Abroad.
